The Excelsior Kings River Resource Conservation District (EKRCRD) WELLUP Program, funded by CDFA's Water Efficiency Technical Assistance (WETA) Program, helps farmers in Fresno, Kings, and Tulare Counties strengthen water supply resilience. Through this program, producers can access free pump efficiency testing and qualify for Irrigation Water Management Plans (NRCS DIA 163) and/or Surface Irrigation Water Management Plans, both require an EKRCRD WELLUP pump/well test. *Special incentives are available for Socially Disadvantaged Farmers and Ranchers* (SDFR).*
